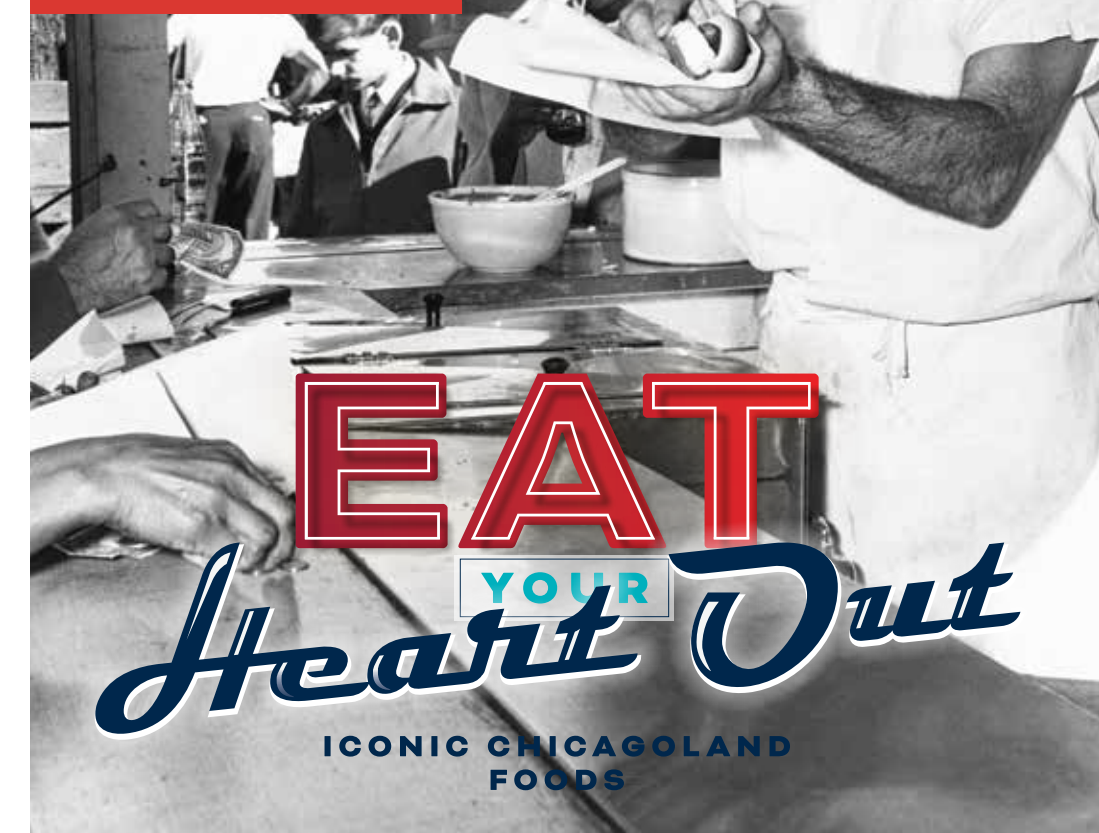

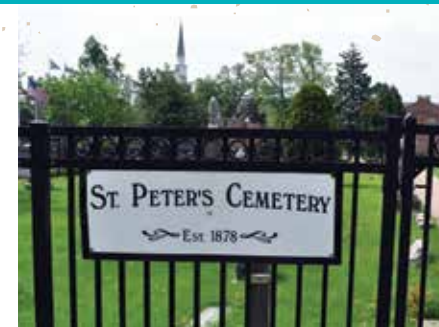

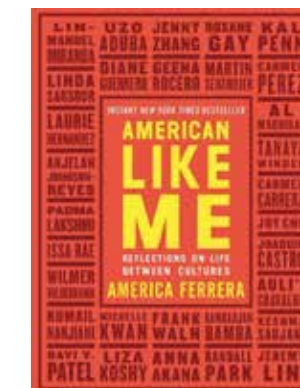
In Pursuit of Happiness:
